

XVIII AUSTRALIAN MASTERS GAMES
SMALLBORE RIFLE SHOOTING – 9th – 12th October 2021

Question & Answers

1. What events will be in this year's Masters?

Most events will not be physically demanding formats for all age categories with breaks after 20 shots or with plenty of time to finish. The full details of events can be found on the Australian Masters Web site at <https://australianmastersgames.com/sport/shooting-smallbore-air-rifle>. There is plenty of details in the Overview and Additional Info links.

2. What do I need to do to legally bring and store my firearms into WA?

A WA Police Temporary License needs to be held by each person with details of any firearms they intend to carry in WA and the dates it will be in WA must be provided. Part of the Entry Form collects these details and if the details are lodged/updated on your entry at least six weeks before the event then this will be issued FREE to all competitors. Any late changes or late entries will need to be personally arranged with the WA Police and a substantial fee will be incurred.

3. Where is the new Perth Smallbore Rifle Range?

It is located as a venue on the Whiteman Park International Shooting Complex in the outer northern suburbs of Perth. More details can be found on the Masters web site or by simply doing a Google Map search for 200 Jules Steiner Memorial Drive. The complex will also host pistol, clay target and archery events. And at least one combined social event is being planned for Saturday night. All competitors will receive a map with instructions to navigate the tricky entrance from the Tonkin Hwy interchange.

4. What accommodation is found near to the range?

All accommodation is at least a 15min drive but there is a big 180 arc of all forms of accommodation from the Swan Valley Winery region to the east around to the city in the south and beach front locations to the west. All within relatively straight 40min drive. If hospitals are important there is the Royal Perth in the city, with Midland to the east and Joondalup to the northwest all reasonable close.

5. Will secure firearm storage be provided during our stay in WA?

WASRA expects to be able to offer to securely store eastern state visitors' firearms and equipment on site for the duration of everyone's stay in WA.

6. What other shooting might be available while in WA?

The WA State Championships are currently scheduled to be held over the two following weekends – Prone (October 16th 17th) and Benchrest (Oct 23rd 24th).

7. Can I purchase ammunition when I get to Perth?

WASRA doesn't formally stock or deal in any ammunition. Arrangements with local dealers will be arranged for them to stock and sell ammunition to eastern state competitors. If anyone has specific needs then please provide details to the competition secretary and every effort will be made to ensure they can be purchased from a dealer on arrival.

8. Can I use my own benchrest stool or seat?

A range of office chairs and stools are available on the range as suitable benchrest seating. Personal seat/stools will be permitted to be used.
