

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

# 1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Australian Sailing Prescriptions and Special Regulations Part 2 Off the Beach Boats will apply. It will be the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that personal flotation devices comply with a standard equivalent to those listed in Special Regulations 5.01 Personal Flotation Devices, are maintained and in good condition.
- 1.3 The class rules of the respective classes shall apply.
- 1.4 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two Turns Penalty is replaced by the One Turn Penalty.
- 1.5 Any amendments to this Notice of Race will be posted on the event website prior to 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019.

# 2. Advertising

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies [DP]

# 3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all single handed dinghies **Contender, Finn, Hansa Liberty, Impulse, Laser 4.7, Laser Radial, Laser Full Rig, OK Dinghy, Sabre, Spiral.** that comply with the Rules of the Class Association. All competitors must be at least a member of a yacht club affiliated with Australian Sailing.
- 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration by 8<sup>th</sup> October 2019. All entries must be accompanied by the required fee. Entries after August 3<sup>rd</sup> incur a late entry fee.
- 3.3 A confirmation email and receipt will be sent to the nominated email address once an entry has been made. Entries will be displayed on the event website.

# 4. Fees

- 4.1 The entry fees for the regatta are
  - Sport Entry fee \$80
  - Masters Games entry fee \$125, (\$110 if over 70 years of age) prior to 1st August 2023
  - Late entry Masters Games fee (after 1<sup>st</sup> August 2023) \$30.00 (\$35.00 if over 70 years of age)
- 4.2 Other fees for social functions will be advised at the regatta and on the event website.

- 5.1 Nine (9) races are scheduled.
- 5.2 There will be no warning signal made after 1600 hrs on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2023.
- 5.3 No more than 3 races will be sailed back to back
- 5.4 No more than 4 races will be sailed in a day.

#### 6. Measurement and Equipment

6.1 The technical committee reserves the right to inspect any boat and equipment at any time during the regatta to ensure compliance with the Rules.

#### 7. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will be posted on the regatta website no later than seven days prior to the event, and will be available from the registration desk at the event.

# 8. Venue

- 8.1 The regatta location is Adelaide Sailing Club, Barcoo Road, West Beach. Attachment 1 shows the location of the regatta site.
- 8.2 Attachment 2 shows the approximate location of the racing area.

#### 9. Courses

- 9.1 The courses will be Windward/Leeward or Triangular as described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2 The approximate race duration will be 40 minutes.

#### 10. Penalty System

- 10.1 Appendix T, Arbitration may apply, except as changed by NoR 10.3
- 10.2 T1 (b) 30% Scoring Penalty is changed to 20% Scoring Penalty.

# 11. Scoring

- 11.1 The regatta will consist of up to nine races of which two races must be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 The number of races to count will be as follows:
  - (a) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

- (b) When from five to seven races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (c) When eight or nine races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst two scores.

# 12. Safety.

- 12.1 Attention is drawn to Rule 1.2 and Rule 4
- 12.2 Discretionary penalties will apply to Rule 41 Outside Help. Actions by the Race Committee in retrieving crews and returning them to their boats may not be penalised.

# 13. Support Boats

- 13.1 Coach and support boats shall register before racing commences by completing the form available at registration. [DP]
- 13.2. Each coach/support boat is required to have a working VHF radio tuned into a frequency designated by the Race Committee and be available to act as a rescue boat as directed by the Race Committee if required [DP]

# 14. Media

- 14.1 In submitting the entry form, all competitors, parents, legal guardians and custodians provide their permission for all photographs, video, TV and sound recordings to be the property of the organisers and used for any purpose including public viewing and posting on the event website.

# 15. Prizes

- 15.1. The following prizes will be awarded;
  - Trophies based on Yardstick within age divisions
    - 30 44
    - 45 59
    - 60 69
    - Over 70
  - Any class with more than 10 entries will have prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in that class overall.
  - 1st Female overall

15.2. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

# 16. Radio Communication

16.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication. [DP]

#### 17. Insurance

- 17.1 All boats competing in the Australian Masters Games shall be insured with third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUS\$5,000,000 per incident.
- 17.2 All competitors who submit the Entry Form are deemed to have made a declaration that they hold such cover.
- 17.3 Competitors may be required to provide details and evidence that they have such insurance in place at the time of entry.

# 18. Disclaimer

- 18.1 It is the competitor's decision to enter an Event or to start and continue in any race. Competitors shall accept that their participation in an Event is at their exclusive risk in every respect. See Racing Rule 4, *Decision to Race*.
- 18.2 None of the Organising Authority, their officers, members, volunteers, servants or agents accept any responsibility whatsoever in respect of loss of life, personal injury or damage to property which may be sustained by reason of their participation or intended participation in this event or howsoever arising in connection with the event.
